APPLYING FOR ADMISSIONS

How do I apply to the University of Utah? Applying to The University of Utah is simple! The application for admissions can be found by searching for The University of Utah on the [Common Application](#). You may also apply on the University of Utah's Office of Admissions website at <https://admissions.utah.edu/apply/>. Lastly, the Common Application offers a helpful guide for first-time students at <https://www.commonapp.org/apply/first-time-students>.

What is required for a complete freshman application? All students must submit an application, application fee, official ACT or SAT Scores, official high school transcripts or official GED scores (if applicable). Letters of recommendations are not required.

How do I send my official high school transcript? You may request for your official high school transcripts to be sent through the Common Application. You will need to include your high school counselor's information in the application. Once you submit your application, your counselor will receive an email notification to submit your transcript as part of their School Report. Your counselor may also send electronic transcripts to admisstranscripts@sa.utah.edu through any one of the following services: Parchment, National Student Clearinghouse, Credentials Solutions, or Scrip-Safe. Official transcripts may also be mailed to the Office of Admissions, 201 S 1460 E, Rm 250S, Salt Lake City, UT 84112.

How do I send my official ACT or SAT test scores? Official ACT or SAT test scores must be requested directly from ACT (www.act.org) or CollegeBoard (www.collegeboard.org). You can request that your scores be sent to the University of Utah using the following test codes 4274 for the ACT or 4853 for the SAT. Test scores that are included in your high school transcript will not be accepted.

How do I request an application fee waiver? The University of Utah wants to ensure that the application fee does not pose a barrier. If you feel that your financial circumstances might qualify you for an application fee waiver, you can request a fee waiver in the Common Application Fee Waiver section which is in the Profile section.

How do I track the status of my application for admissions? Your application will be evaluated once we receive a completed application, application fee, and all required documentation. The status of your application can be tracked at <https://student.apps.utah.edu/uofu/stu/admission-checklist/open/landing>. Please allow 7 – 10 business days for the online tracker to reflect newly received materials.

Where do I go if I need support with the Common Application? You may visit the Common Application Solution Center and type in your questions at <https://appsupport.commonapp.org/applicantsupport/s/>. You may also contact with the Common Application Support team at <https://appsupport.commonapp.org/applicantsupport/s/contactsupport/>. Their average response time is an hour.

Who can I contact if I have admissions questions? All high school students have a designated admissions counselor who can help you navigate the admissions process. They are also available to help you explore the many programs and support services available on campus. You may find your admissions counselor at www.admissions.utah.edu.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

I have a PR card, am I an international student? If you've had it for more than five years, you will be processed as domestic – if you've had it for less than five years, you will be processed as international. Regardless of status, permanent residents will need to send a scanned copy of their PR card to iao@sa.utah.edu.

I am an international student, how do I provide English proficiency? You may demonstrate English proficiency in one of the following ways: (1) ACT English score of 18 or greater; SAT Reading score of 27 or greater; iBT/TOEFL of 80 or greater; or IELTS of 6.5 or greater; (2) Attend at least 2.5 years and graduate, or plan to graduate, from a U.S. or U.S. regionally accredited high school, and receive grades of A or B in non-ESL level English classes; (3) Native speaker of the English language and a citizen of Australia, Canada (except Quebec), Ireland, New Zealand, or the United Kingdom (England, Scotland, Wales, Northern Ireland).

What is the last ACT or SAT test I can take to qualify for the November 1 priority deadline? The September tests are the last ones we can consider for scholarship and admissions purposes during our priority review.

SCHOLARSHIPS AND FINANCIAL AID

When will I find out what scholarships I qualify for? If you submit a complete application by November 1, you will be automatically considered for merit scholarships, and will receive your scholarship notification letter in your admissions packet starting on January 15th.
